 Operational practices to ensure that staff are skilled and implementing developmentally
appropriate lesson plans, as well as to ensure that you are informed of your child's growth and development.
Not only do you benefit from this Scholarship, but so does our program in its ability to maintain best
practices in early childhood education. We use the tuition we receive to enhance quality of our learning
materials, support training teachers and staff, and ensure a safe and healthy environment.

Summary of Attendance Expectations

What is expected of my child and me?

Scholarships are awarded at two levels: Part Time and Full Time.

A part time scholarship requires that your child be scheduled to attend a minimum of **eight (8) days** and **34 hours** per month. A full time scholarship requires that your child be scheduled to attend a minimum of **eight (8) days** and **93 hours** per month.

Your early education and childcare QF participant may **revoke your scholarship** if your child fails to attend at least **85%** of the time that they are scheduled. Absences are considered excused at the discretion of your participant, however, your participant cannot charge you additional fees for absences as the QF Scholarship reimbursement covers days scheduled and includes absences. Chronic and/or unexcused absences should be addressed through your participant's absenteeism policy. It is your responsibility to comply with your participant's policy for documenting excused absences.

Benefits of Consistent Attendance

The Quality First Scholarships Program was developed to provide access to high quality early childcare and education. Inconsistent attendance is one of the most significant barriers to your child receiving early learning opportunities. In contrast, consistent attendance helps contribute to success in an early learning environment and your child's future education in the following ways:

- → Children **thrive** in the care of familiar caregivers who play a **significant role** in their lives over time
- → Children who remain with the same group of children longer are more peer-oriented and less solitary over time than those whose peer groups have changed frequently; and they are friendlier toward peers in distress
- → Children with **consistent** preschool attendance have **higher** kindergarten readiness scores
- → Consistent attendance is a habit, that if formed early, will continue into later years
